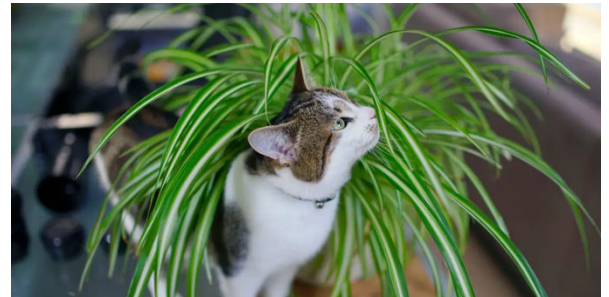


PLANTS AND PETS

KEEP YOUR PLANT AND PETS SAFE WITH THIS LIST OF CAT & DOG FRIENDLY HOUSEPLANTS AND PET-SAFE REPELLENTS

Non-toxic Houseplants:

- *Acalypha hispida* (**Chenille plant**)
- *Araucaria Heterophylla* (**Norfolk Island Pine**)
- *Arecaceae Robellini* (**Date palm**)
- *Aspidistra elatior* (**Cast iron plant**)
- *Asplenium nidus* (**Bird's Nest fern**)
- *Beaucarnea recurvata* (**Ponytail palm**)
- **Bromeliad**
- *Calathea lancifolia* (**Rattlesnake plant**)
- *Calathea orbifolia* (**Prayer plant**)
- *Chamaedorea elegans* (**parlor palm, neanthe bella palm**)
- *Chlorophytum comosum* (**Spider plant**)
- *Davallia fejeensis* (**Rabbit's Foot Fern**)
- *Dionaea muscipula* (**Venus fly trap**)

REPELLANTS:

There are lots of suggestions for helping keep plants safe from their furry roommates. Many choose to designate a room that can be restricted from the animals, or making the plant inaccessible by putting them in hangers, wall planters, or on high shelves.

Repellants can be applied on top of the soil:

- Cayenne pepper
- Citrus peels (be sure to discard before they mold)
- Tin foil
- Heavy stones (not pebbles or sand)
- In addition, we carry these repellents (pictured below): I Must Garden Dog & Cat Repellent (spray) Bonide RepelsAll (granules)

Other Methods:

- Training the animal with water spray bottle
- Planting catnip, cat grass, lemon balm, or thyme in a plastic (or sacrificial) container. Keep them in a sunny, accessible window away from the other plants. This will safely satisfy their horticultural curiosity, and limit their desire for other plants.
